

(10599.) OTAGO CLOTHING TRADE.—AMENDMENT OF
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Otago Provincial District Clothing Trade apprenticeship order, dated the 9th day of March, 1927, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVII, p. 52.

Tuesday, the 27th day of February, 1934.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the clothing trade in the Otago Provincial District has made application to the Court for amendment of the Otago Provincial District Clothing Trade apprenticeship order, dated the

9th day of March, 1927, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVII, p. 52: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said order shall be amended by inserting the following clause after clause 3 thereof:—

“3A. Every employer desiring to employ an apprentice in any branch or branches of the trade shall, before engaging the proposed apprentice, make application in writing to the Apprenticeship Committee and the Committee shall either grant or refuse the apprentice after inquiry into the facilities within the scope of the employer's business for teaching the proposed apprentice the branch or branches of the trade.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
