THE Court of Arbitration of New Zealand (hereinafter called "the Court"), having taken into consideration the matter of the above-mentioned dispute, and having heard the union by its representatives duly appointed, and having also heard such of the employers as were represented either in person or by their representatives duly appointed, and having also heard the witnesses called and examined and cross-examined by and on behalf of the said parties respectively, doth hereby order and award:—

That, as between the union and the members thereof and the employers and each and every of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions set out in the schedule hereto and of this award shall be binding upon the union and upon every member thereof and upon the employers and upon each and every of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated in and declared to form part of this award; and, further, that the union and every member thereof and the employers and each and every of them shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by this award and by the said terms, conditions, and provisions respectively required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of this award or of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by and perform the same. And the Court doth hereby further award, order, and declare that any breach of the said terms, conditions, and provisions set out in the schedule hereto shall constitute a breach of this award, and that a penalty as by law provided shall be payable by any party or person in respect thereof. And the Court doth further order that this award shall take effect as hereinafter provided and shall continue in force until the 31st day of December, 1936, and thereafter as provided by subsection (1) (d) of section 89 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925.

In witness whereof the seal of the Court of Arbitration hath hereto been affixed, and the Judge of the Court hath hereunto set his hand, this 13th day of June, 1935.

SCHEDULE.

*Hours of Work.*

1. Except as hereinafter provided the hours of work shall be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on every week-day except Saturday, and on Saturday from 8 a.m. to noon.

One hour shall be allowed for dinner on each day except Saturday, but an employer may agree with his workers to allow not less than half an hour for dinner so that the work shall cease between 4.30 p.m. and 5 p.m.

#### *Wages.*

2. The minimum rate of wages for a journeyman plumber or gasfitter shall be 2s. 1d. per hour.

#### *Payment of Wages.*

3. (a) All wages shall be paid in cash weekly, not later than Friday, within working-hours, either on the job or at the employer's workshop.

(b) In the event of Friday being a holiday, wages shall be paid under the same conditions as set out in subclause (a) hereof on the day preceding the holiday.

(c) When a worker is discharged, or leaves at any time other than the ordinary pay-time for the week, he shall be paid without delay all wages due to him at the time of his dismissal or time of leaving, as the case may be.

#### *Overtime.*

4. (a) Overtime shall be worked as required by the employer. All time worked in excess of the hours fixed by clause 1 hereof shall be paid for as follows: On Monday to Friday (inclusive), time and a quarter until 9 p.m. and from 6 a.m. to 8 a.m., time and a half from 9 p.m. until midnight, and double time from midnight until 6 a.m.; on Saturday, time and a quarter from 6 a.m. to 8 a.m., and after 12 noon time and a quarter for the first three hours worked, time and a half for the second three hours worked, and double time thereafter.

(b) Any worker having worked continuously all day and night shall not be required to continue working without his consent. If he does continue working he shall be paid at time and a half rates for all time worked on the second day.

(c) Any worker who after working overtime is unable to reach his home by the usual public means of travelling shall be provided with means of conveyance by his employer.

(d) No worker shall be employed for more than five hours continuously without an interval for a meal.

#### *Holidays.*

5. (a) The recognized holidays shall be New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, and the annual trade picnic day if such picnic is in fact held.

(b) Work done on Sundays, Good Friday, Christmas Day, or Anzac Day shall be paid for at double rates.

(c) Work done on any of the other holidays mentioned herein shall be paid for at time and a half rates.

#### *Suburban Work.*

6. (a) Suburban work means work performed outside a radius of two miles from the employer's place of business, but does not in any case include work which comes within the definition of "country work."

(b) Workers employed on suburban work shall either proceed to and from such work, or they shall be conveyed to and from such work, at the expense of the employer, as the employer shall in each case determine. Time reasonably occupied by the workers in journeying or time occupied in conveying the workers to and from such work beyond the two-miles radius shall be allowed and paid for by the employer at ordinary rates.

(c) No worker residing within one and a half miles from the place where the work is to be performed, by the nearest convenient mode of access for foot passengers, shall be entitled to the allowance mentioned in this clause.

#### *Country Work.*

7. (a) Should a worker be required by his employer to proceed to work in the country at such a distance from his usual place of employment that he is unable to return to his usual place of abode on the same day, the employer shall either provide such worker with suitable board and lodgings, or, in lieu thereof, pay him an additional sum of 4s. 6d. per day for each working-day.

(b) Workers who are required to proceed to country work as aforesaid shall be conveyed by the employer to and from such work free of charge, or their travelling-expenses going to and returning from such work shall be paid by the employer, but once only during the continuance of the work unless the worker is recalled and again sent to the job.

(c) Time occupied in travelling to and from the work shall be paid for at ordinary rates, but no worker shall be paid more than an ordinary day's pay for any day occupied by him in travelling, even though the hours occupied may exceed eight, unless he is on the same day occupied in working for his employer.

(d) When the work is situated less than fifty miles from the employer's place of business the worker shall be refunded his return railway fare to and from the place of engagement once every four weeks during the continuance of the work.

(e) When the work is situated over fifty miles from the employer's place of business the refund shall be made once in each three months.

(f) The foregoing shall not restrict the right of any employer from engaging any worker who applies on a country job (other than at the employer's usual place of business) for work thereon, without making any payment in regard to fares, travelling-time, or board and lodgings, except in the event of there not being suitable accommodation available within a reasonable distance of the job, when the employer shall provide suitable accommodation for all employees.

(g) Notwithstanding anything herein contained, any employer and his workers may agree in writing that in respect of any specified country work the hours of work shall be other than those hereinbefore prescribed without payment of overtime, but so that not less than the minimum rate of wages per hour hereinbefore prescribed shall be paid to such workers: Provided that if a worker is ordered to work on a Sunday he shall be paid double time.

#### *Notice of Leaving or Dismissal.*

8. In case of dismissal, except for misconduct, of any worker, or of any worker leaving of his own accord, not less than two hours' notice shall be given on either side. Any moneys due at such time shall be paid without delay.

#### *Tools.*

9. (a) Employers shall provide journeymen with soldering-bolts, pipe-fitting tools, metal-pots, springs, hack-saw blades, mendrels, and files. Journeymen shall find all other tools required for their work, including pipe-fitting tongs up to 1½ in. pipes. All tools shall be returned in good condition, reasonable wear-and-tear excepted, or they shall be paid for by the employee. Lamps shall be kept in good repair by the employer, provided they are not wilfully damaged by the employee.

(b) Where work is done elsewhere than at the place of business of the employer, he shall provide, when necessary, upon the premises where the work is to be done, a properly secured place for the tools of the employer and the employee.

#### *Carrying Materials.*

10. Time occupied by workers carrying materials or a kit of tools to and from the employer's shop or place of work shall be paid for as time worked.

*Dirty Work and Special Working-conditions.*

11. (a) Where it is mutually agreed between the employer and his worker or workers that any particular work such as repairing hot-water services at the boiler, or between the boiler and cylinder where the hot-plate or covering of the range has to be removed, or cleaning septic tanks, or clearing drains or soil-pipes, &c., is dirty work, dirt-money at the rate of 1s. 6d. per day shall be paid. In the event of any dispute regarding any particular work under this clause, the matter shall be referred to the Disputes Committee provided for in this award.

(b) Ships: Any worker employed at dirty work, such as under lower platform of engine-room or in bilges, or confined spaces about the ship's boilers—that is to say, between ship's sides and boilers—between bulkhead and back end of single-ended boilers, or in tunnels, or in tanks, or clearing or repairing choked scupper-pipes, shall be paid 1s. 6d. per day extra as dirt-money. On all ships carrying crude oil in bulk, workers required to work in the tank-holds, or on pipes where the workers are necessarily in contact with crude oil, shall be paid 2s. 6d. per day in addition to the ordinary rate of wages.

(c) Any worker working with pumice, charcoal, or silicate in connection with insulation work in any confined or unventilated space, or where the air is impregnated with dust of any of these materials, or employed where recent fumigation has occurred, or in freezing-chambers, or cool storage where the temperature is 40 degrees or less, shall be paid 3d. per hour higher rates of wages while so employed, and shall be allowed ten minutes spell after two hours have been worked continuously without any reduction of wages.

(d) Any worker required to work in any compartment or confined space where the heat exceeds 110 degrees Fahrenheit shall be paid his ordinary time rates in addition to the rates otherwise payable to him. No worker shall be compelled to work in any place where the temperature has been raised above 150 degrees Fahrenheit.

(e) All bosun-chair work shall be paid for at the rate of 1s. per day extra.

(f) The "day" for the purpose of this award shall mean any portion of the twenty-four hours a worker shall be employed at that work.

*Meal-money.*

12. In the case of any workers who cannot reasonably journey to and from their homes for meals being called back to work after 6 p.m. on any day, the employer shall provide them with a meal, or, at the employer's option, shall pay each worker 1s.

tea-money. In the event of any worker situated as aforesaid being called back to work after 1 p.m. on the half-holiday, and not having been given notice on the previous day of his being required to so work, the employer shall provide such worker with a mid-day meal, or, at the employer's option, pay such worker 1s. tea-money.

*Bicycle Allowance.*

13. Any worker using his own bicycle on the employer's business shall be paid 1s. per week in addition to his ordinary wage, or, in lieu thereof, by mutual agreement in writing between the employer and the worker, may be paid 1d. per mile or portion of a mile.

*Piecework.*

14. Piecework may be worked, but in no case shall any rates for piecework be agreed on which will earn for any worker less than 10 per cent. in addition to the rate of wages prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

*Under-rate Workers.*

15. (a) Any worker who considers himself incapable of earning the minimum wage fixed by this award may be paid such lower wage as may from time to time be fixed, on the application of the worker after due notice to the union, by the local Inspector of Awards or such other person as the Court may from time to time appoint for that purpose; and such Inspector or other person in so fixing such wage shall have regard to the worker's capability, his past earnings, and such other circumstances as such Inspector or other person shall think fit to consider after hearing such evidence and argument as the union and such worker shall offer.

(b) Such permit shall be for such period, not exceeding six months, as such Inspector or other person shall determine, and after the expiration of such period shall continue in force until fourteen days' notice shall have been given to such worker by the secretary of the union requiring him to have his wage again fixed in manner prescribed by this clause: Provided that in the case of any person whose wage is so fixed by reason of old age or permanent disability it may be fixed for such longer period as such Inspector or other person shall think fit.

(c) Notwithstanding the foregoing, it shall be competent for a worker to agree in writing with the president or secretary of the union upon such wage without having the same so fixed.

(d) It shall be the duty of the union to give notice to the Inspector of Awards of every agreement made with a worker pursuant hereto.

(e) It shall be the duty of an employer, before employing a worker at such lower wage, to examine the permit or agreement by which such wage is fixed.

*Preference.*

16. (a) If any employer shall hereafter engage any worker coming within the scope of this award who shall not be a member of the union, and who shall not become a member thereof within seven days after his engagement and remain such member, the employer shall dismiss such worker from his service if requested to do so by the union, provided there is then a member of the union equally qualified to perform the particular work required to be done, and ready and willing to undertake the same. The provisions of this subclause relating to the dismissal of workers shall apply, with equal effect, to any worker coming within the scope of this award engaged since the 2nd day of January, 1928, but before the coming into force of this award, who is not a member of the union during the currency of this award.

(b) The provisions of this clause shall operate only if and so long as the rules of the union shall permit any worker coming within the scope of this award of good character and sober habits to become a member of the union, upon payment of an entrance fee not exceeding 5s., upon a written application, without ballot or other election, and to continue a member upon payment of subsequent contributions not exceeding 1s. per week, and such fines as may be lawfully imposed on him for non-attendance without reasonable excuse at a specially called meeting of the union, of which written notice has been given to him or sent to him by post at his last address as notified by him to the union, or for misconduct at a meeting of the union, or for being more than three months in arrear, without reasonable excuse, in his contributions to the union: Provided that the maximum fine shall not exceed 2s. 6d. for non-attendance at a meeting of the union or for being in arrear with his contributions, and £1 for misconduct at a meeting of the union.

(c) Employers are requested, if desired by the union, to supply a list of their employees covered by this award.

*Disputes.*

17. The essence of this award being that the work of the employers shall not on any account whatsoever be impeded, but shall always proceed as if no dispute had arisen, it is provided that if any dispute or difference shall arise between the parties

bound by this award or any of them, as to any matter whatsoever arising out of or connected therewith, and not dealt with in this award, every such dispute or difference shall be referred to a committee to be composed of two representatives of each side, together with an independent chairman to be mutually agreed upon, or, in default of agreement, to be appointed by the Conciliation Commissioner for the district. Either side shall have the right to appeal to the Court against a decision of any such Committee upon giving to the other side written notice of such appeal within fourteen days after such decision has been made known to the party desirous of appealing.

#### *Interpretation.*

18. "Plumbing work" shall be deemed to mean and include lead-burning; ship's plumbing; all sanitary work; gas-fitting; hot and cold water fitting; hot water and heating apparatus; fixing of roofing, spouting, downpipes, gutters, valleys, and flashings in any metal; iron drainpipes and vents to any house or building: Provided that this definition shall not operate to prevent any engineer from doing any work in connection with the fitting of hot-water or heating apparatus which does not come under the provisions of the Plumbers' Registration Act, 1912, or to prevent a carpenter from fixing any corrugated roofing.

#### *Exemptions.*

19. (a) The following special provisions shall apply to all gas companies, and to all City, Borough, or Town Councils so far as their operations in connection with the supply of gas are concerned:—

- (1) "Plumbing work" as defined by this award shall not be deemed to include the following: (i) The laying of gas-mains in any street or public place; (ii) the laying of gas-service pipes from the main to the meter; (iii) the fixing of any gas-meter.
- (2) The wages of all journeymen gasfitters in the employment of any of the said companies or Councils shall be 2s. 1d. per hour.
- (3) When workers coming within the scope of this award are employed by any of the said companies or Councils in or about their workshops they may be employed for forty-four hours without payment of overtime: Provided that they shall not be employed for more than eight hours and a half in any one day or four hours and a quarter on Saturday.

(b) The following special provisions shall apply to City, Borough, or Town Councils: "Plumbing work" as defined in this award shall not be deemed to include the following: (i) The laying of water-mains in any street or public place; (ii) the laying of water-service pipes from the main to the building-line of an allotment.

(c) Freezing companies shall not be bound by this award in respect of their respective foremen plumbers and other plumbers permanently employed by them, provided such workers are paid not less than the rates of wages prescribed by this award.

(d) Harbour Boards are bound by such only of the provisions of this award as relate to the payment of the minimum rates of wages and overtime and the observance of Sundays and holidays. Harbour Boards may substitute the holidays observed under their own regulations in lieu of those provided for in this award.

(e) The Otago Hospital Board shall be granted an exemption similar to that granted to Harbour Boards under subclause (d).

#### *Scope of Award.*

20. This award shall operate throughout the Canterbury and Otago and Southland Industrial Districts.

#### *Term of Award.*

21. This award, in so far as it relates to wages, shall be deemed to have come into force on the 7th day of June, 1935, and so far as all the other conditions of this award are concerned it shall come into force on the day of the date hereof, and this award shall continue in force until the 31st day of December, 1936.

In witness whereof the seal of the Court of Arbitration hath hereto been put and affixed, and the Judge of the Court hath hereunto set his hand, this 13th day of June, 1935.
