

(10826.) OTAGO ELECTRICAL WORKERS.—AMENDMENT OF
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Otago Electrical Workers, Apprenticeship Order, dated the 17th day of October, 1929, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXIX, p. 725.

Thursday, the 13th day of June, 1935.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Otago Electrical Workers' Apprenticeship Committee has made application to the Court for amendment of the Otago Electrical Workers' Apprenticeship order, dated the 17th day of October, 1929, and

recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXIX, p. 725: Now, therefore the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said Order, in so far as it affects that part of the Otago and Southland Industrial District lying within a radius of twenty miles from the Chief Post-office in the City of Dunedin, shall be amended by inserting the following clause after clause 3 thereof:—

“ 3A. Every employer desiring to employ an apprentice in any branch or branches of the trade shall, before engaging the proposed apprentice, make application in writing to the Apprenticeship Committee, and the Committee shall either grant or refuse the apprentice, after inquiring into the facilities within the scope of the proposed employer's business for teaching the branch or branches of the trade.

“ Any temporary transfer of an apprentice to another employer must be sanctioned by the Committee before being effected.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
