

(11310.) FACTORIES AMENDMENT ACT, 1936.—ORDER EXTENDING WORKING-HOURS IN RESPECT OF THE **NEW ZEALAND PUMICE CO., HOROTIU, HAMILTON.**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Factories Amendment Act, 1936; and in the matter of an application by Henry Aldred Kernott (trading as the "New Zealand Pumice Co."), Horotiu, Hamilton, for an extension of the limits of working-hours prescribed by section 3 (1) of the said Act.

Monday the 7th day of December, 1936.

UPON reading the application of Henry Aldred Kernott (trading as the New Zealand Pumice Co., Horotiu, Hamilton, for an extension of the limits of working-hours prescribed by section 3 (1) of the Factories Amendment Act, 1936, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said company and the workers concerned, this Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 3 (5) of the said Act, and with the consent of the said representatives, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the maximum number of hours (exclusive of over-time) to be worked in any week by any worker employed by the said company shall be fixed at 44.

2. That this order shall come into force on the day of the date hereof, and shall continue in force until the 31st day of August, 1937.
