

(11322.) NEW ZEALAND PASSENGER TRANSPORT DRIVERS.—
AMENDMENT OF AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act, 1936; and in the matter of an application by the New Zealand Federated Drivers and Related Trades Industrial Association of Workers for amendment of the New Zealand Passenger Transport Drivers' award, dated the 7th day of April, 1936, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVI, p. 131.

JUDGMENT OF THE COURT, DELIVERED BY PAGE, J.

THIS is an application to amend the New Zealand Passenger Transport Drivers' award, dated the 7th day of April, 1936, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVI, p. 131.

We think that a case for amendment has been made out.

We amend the award as follows:—

1. As to omnibus-drivers (Part I of the award), by substituting in clause 2 (a) of the award the word "eighty" for the words "ninety-six," and by substituting the words "forty-four" for the words "fifty-two."

2. As to service-car drivers (Part II of the award), by substituting in clause 9 (a) of the award the words "eighty-eight" for the words "ninety-six," and by substituting the words "forty-eight" for the words "fifty-two."

3. By adjusting the rates of pay in accordance with subsection (3) of section 21 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act, 1936, so that the ordinary rates of weekly wages of any worker shall not be reduced by reason of the reduction made in the number of his working-hours.
