AUCKLAND (TEN-MILE RADIUS) HAIRDRESSERS.—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Auckland (Ten-mile radius) Hairdressers' Apprenticeship Order dated the 28th day of April, 1926, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVI, p. 209.

Monday, the 8th day of February, 1937.

Whereas by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act; and whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the hairdressing trade in the Auckland district has made application to the Court for an amendment of the Auckland (Ten-mile radius) Hairdressers' Apprenticeship Order dated the 28th day of April, 1926, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVI, p. 209. Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That such order shall be amended by striking out clauses 1 and 21 thereof, and substituting the following clauses

therefor:—

"1. The locality in which this order shall have effect is the Northern Industrial District (except Gisborne Judicial District).

"21. The powers conferred on the Court by paragraphs (b) to (l) inclusive of section 5 (4) of the said Act are hereby delegated by the Court to the said committee in so far as those powers relate to the said industry in that part of the Northern Industrial District lying within a radius of ten miles from the Chief Post-office at Auckland."

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
