

NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT (EXCEPT GISBORNE JUDICIAL DISTRICT) **CARPENTERS AND JOINERS.**—
AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Northern Industrial District (except Gisborne Judicial District) Carpenters and Joiners' apprenticeship order, dated the 1st day of September, 1936, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVI, p. 602.

Wednesday, the 1st day of September, 1937.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the carpentry and joinery industry in the Northern Industrial District has made application to the Court for amendment of the Northern Industrial District (except Gisborne Judicial District) Carpenters and Joiners' apprenticeship order, dated the 1st day of September, 1936, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVI, p. 602: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said order shall be amended by striking out from clause 15 thereof the words "be those normally worked by journeymen in accordance with the provisions of the award or industrial agreement relating to the employment of journeymen for the time being in force in the district," and substituting therefor the words "be not more than eight hours per day, to be worked between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on five days of the week, Monday to Friday inclusive."

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
