

NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT PAINTERS AND DECORATORS.—DELEGATING POWERS TO APPRENTICESHIP COMMITTEE.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Northern Industrial District Painters and Decorators' Apprenticeship Order, dated the 26th day of August, 1924, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXV, p. 809.

Wednesday, the 18th day of August, 1937.

WHEREAS on the 26th day of August, 1924, an order was made under the provisions of the Apprentices Act, 1923, prescribing the wages, hours, and other conditions of employment to be incorporated in contracts of apprenticeship in the painting and decorating industry in the Northern Industrial District:

And whereas an Apprenticeship Committee has been set up for that part of the said district lying within a radius of twenty miles from the Chief Post-office, Gisborne: And whereas the said Committee has applied to the Court to have delegated to it the powers conferred on the Court by paragraphs (b) to (l) inclusive of section 5 (4) of the said Act: Now, therefore, the Court doth hereby order that, as from the day of the date hereof, the said powers are hereby delegated to the said Committee in so far as those powers relate to the said industry in that part of the Northern Industrial District lying within a radius of twenty miles from the Chief Post-office, Gisborne, but reserving, nevertheless, power to the Court at any time and from time to time to withdraw all or any of such powers.
