

CANTERBURY **BOOT-REPAIRING TRADE.**—AMENDMENT OF  
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Canterbury Boot-repairing Trade apprenticeship order, dated the 4th day of April, 1927, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVII, p. 243.

Thursday, the 7th day of October, 1937.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act; And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the boot-repairing trade in the Canterbury Industrial District has made application to the Court for an amendment of the Canterbury Boot-repairing Trade apprenticeship order, dated the 4th day of April, 1927,

and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVII, p. 243; Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said order shall be amended by striking out subclause (a) of clause 9 thereof, and substituting the following subclause therefor:—

“9. (a) The minimum rates of wages payable to apprentices shall be according to their respective ages at the time of commencing to serve as apprentices, and not less than the following:—
