

NORTHERN, WELLINGTON, CANTERBURY, AND OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND **WICKER-WORKERS.**—STRIKING OUT PARTY FROM AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Northern, Wellington, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Wicker-workers' award, dated the 6th day of April, 1937, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVII, p. 723.

Wednesday, the 30th day of March, 1938.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section 92 (1) (a) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and for the purpose of remedying a defect in the Northern, Wellington, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Wicker-workers' award, dated the 6th day of April, 1937, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVII, p. 723, this Court, after hearing the duly appointed representatives of the parties to the said award, being of opinion that it is just and equitable to amend the said award, and for the purpose of remedying a defect in the said award, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by striking out from the list of parties thereto the name of—

Jubilee Institute for the Blind, Wicker-workers, 249 Parnell Road, Auckland, S.E. 1.

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.

MEMORANDUM.

The Jubilee Institute for the Blind made application to the Conciliation Council to be struck out from the list of parties to the dispute, and its application was refused.
