

NORTHERN, CANTERBURY, AND OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND  
**FLOUR-MILLS EMPLOYEES.**—EXTENDING SCOPE OF AWARD  
 AND ADDING PARTIES.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern, Wellington, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Industrial Districts.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Northern, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Flour-mills Employees' award, dated the 18th day of June, 1937, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVII, p. 1121.

UPON reading the application to extend the scope of the Northern, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Flour-mills Employees' award, dated the 18th day of June, 1937, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVII, p. 1121, and to add parties thereto, which application was made by the industrial associations of employers and workers parties to the said award, and was filed herein on the 2nd day of March, 1938, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the parties concerned, this Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 92 (1) (b) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the scope of the said award be and it is hereby extended into the Wellington Industrial District.
