

OTAGO FRONT-OF-HOUSE EMPLOYEES.—AMENDMENT OF
AWARD AND STRIKING OUT PARTIES.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Otago Front-of-house Employees' award, dated the 7th day of June, 1938, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVIII, p. 1363.

Monday, the 26th day of September, 1938.

UPON reading the joint application of the parties for amendment of the Otago Front-of-house Employees' award, dated the 7th day of June, 1938, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVIII, p. 1363, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said parties, this Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 92 (1) (c) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by striking out from the list of parties thereto the following names—

Dunedin Repertory Society (Miss Moloney, Secretary, 159 Cargill Street, Dunedin).

Otago University Students' Association, care of University, Dunedin.

Otago Early Settlers' Association, High Street, Dunedin.

2. That the said award shall be further amended by deleting the following words from subclause (b) of clause 3 thereof: "Ticket-takers, doorkeepers, ushers, and other theatre attendants, per week, for a thirty-hour week," and substituting the following words therefor: "Ticket-takers, doorkeepers, ushers, and other theatre attendants, per week, for a thirty-six-hour week."

3. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the 7th day of June, 1938.
