

NEW ZEALAND **PRIVATE-HOTEL EMPLOYEES.**—ADDING
PARTY TO AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and its amendments; and in the matter of the New Zealand Private-hotel Employees' award, dated the 10th day of October, 1938.

Wednesday, the 23rd day of November, 1938.

UPON reading the application of the association of workers party to the New Zealand Private-hotel Employees' award, dated the 10th day of October, 1938, which application was filed herein on the 10th day of May, 1937, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said association of workers and the undermentioned association, this Court, by its duly appointed delegate, doth order as follows:—

1. That the Young Men's Christian Association, Willis Street, Wellington, be and it is hereby added as a party to the said award subject to the following special condition: That clause 24 (staff engagement) of the said award shall not apply to the said association.

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
