

CANTERBURY **ENGINEERING TRADES.**—AMENDMENT OF  
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Canterbury Engineering Trades apprenticeship order, dated the 30th day of December, 1924, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXV, p. 1729.

Friday, the 11th day of March, 1938.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: and whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the engineering trades in the Canterbury Industrial District has made application to the Court for an amendment of the Canterbury Engineering Trades apprenticeship order, dated the 30th day of December, 1924, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXV, p. 1729: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That clause 2 of the said order shall be amended by inserting after the word “moulding” the following words: “This order shall also apply to the work of engineers’ draughtsmen.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
