

FACTORIES AMENDMENT ACT, 1936.—ORDER EXTENDING
WORKING HOURS IN RESPECT OF THE **ELITE BACON, ICE,
AND COOL STORAGE CO., LTD.**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Factories Amendment Act, 1936; and in the matter of an application by the Elite Bacon, Ice, and Cool Storage Co., Ltd., for an extension of the limits of working-hours prescribed by section 3 (1) of the said Act.

Tuesday, the 1st day of March, 1938.

UPON reading the application of the Elite Bacon, Ice, and Cool Storage Co., Ltd., for an extension of the limits of working-hours prescribed by section 3 (1) of the Factories Amendment Act, 1936, and upon hearing the duly appointed representative of the said company, this Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 3 (5) of the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the maximum number of hours (exclusive of overtime) to be worked in any week by any worker employed by the said company shall be fixed at forty-four.

2. That the maximum number of hours that may be worked by any such worker without an interval of at least three-quarters of an hour for a meal shall be five.

3. That this order shall come into force on the day of the date hereof, and shall continue in force until the 1st day of March, 1939.
