NELSON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT **CARPENTERS AND JOINERS**
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.—EXTENDING SCOPE OF APPREN-
TICESHIP COMMITTEE.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Nelson Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Nelson Industrial District Carpenters' and Joiners' apprenticeship order, dated the 23rd day of March, 1925, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXVA, p. 210.

Wednesday, the 13th day of December, 1939.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the carpentering and joinery industry in that part of the Nelson Industrial District lying within a radius of twenty miles from the Chief Post-office in Nelson has made application to the Court for an order extending the locality in which the said Committee is authorized to exercise its powers so as to include the whole of the Nelson Industrial District: And whereas the Court is satisfied that it is the general wish of the employers and workers engaged in the said industry in the Nelson Industrial District that such extension be made: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by section 6 (3) of the Apprentices Amendment Act, 1930, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the locality in which the Nelson Carpenters and Joiners' Apprenticeship Committee is authorized to exercise its powers shall be and it is hereby extended so as to include the whole of the Nelson Industrial District.

2. That this order shall come into force on the day of the date hereof.
