UPON reading the joint application of the parties for amendment of the Taranaki, Wellington, Marlborough, and Canterbury Front-of-House Employees' award, dated the 28th day of November, 1938, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVIII, p. 3459, and for the purpose of remedying a defect in the said award, this Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 92 (1) (a) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and by section 89 of the said Act as amended by section 5 (4) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act (No. 2), 1937, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by striking out from the list of parties thereto the undermentioned society:—

2. That the said society is hereby granted total exemption from the provisions of the said award.

3. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
