

NEW ZEALAND **PRIVATE-HOTEL EMPLOYEES.**—PARTIAL
EXEMPTION FROM AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and its amendments; and in the matter of the New Zealand Private-hotel Employees' award, dated the 10th day of October, 1938, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVIII, p. 2853; and in the matter of an application by Mrs. K. White, Lake Okataina, for exemption from the provisions of the said award.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on the Court by section 89 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, as amended by section 5 (4) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act (No. 2), 1937, partial exemption from the provisions of the New Zealand Private-hotel Employees' award, dated the 10th day of October, 1938, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVIII, p. 2853, is hereby granted to Mrs. K. White, Lake Okataina, as follows:—

Mrs. K. White, Okataina Fishing Lodge, near Rotorua, shall be exempt from the provisions of clauses 7 and 9 of the said award if and so long as she pays to the worker employed by her a wage not less than the rate prescribed for a probationer and observes all the other provisions of the award.
