

WELLINGTON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT **HAIRDRESSERS.**—
AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Wellington Industrial District Hairdressers' apprenticeship order, dated the 14th day of November, 1938, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVIII, p. 3307.

Tuesday, the 3rd day of December, 1940.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the hairdressing trade in the Wellington Industrial District has made application to the Court for an amendment to the Wellington Industrial District Hairdressers' apprenticeship order, dated the 14th day of November, 1938, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVIII, p. 3307: now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said order shall be amended by striking out from clause 5 thereof the words "three years," and substituting therefor the words "four years."

2. That the said order shall be amended by striking out clause 10 thereof, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

The minimum rates of wages payable to apprentices shall be:—
