

WELLINGTON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT PLUMBERS AND GAS-
FITTERS.—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Wellington Industrial District Plumbers' and Gasfitters' apprenticeship order, dated the 30th day of November, 1938, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVIII, p. 3479.

Tuesday, the 9th day of April, 1940.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the plumbing and gasfitting industry in the Wellington Industrial District has made application to the Court for amendment of the Wellington Industrial District Plumbers' and Gasfitters' apprenticeship order, dated the 30th day of November, 1938, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXVIII, p. 3479: And whereas the Court has heard the duly appointed representatives of the employers and workers bound by the said order: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said order shall be amended by adding the following paragraph to clause 17 thereof:—

“No apprentice shall be permitted to work overtime unless he is under the constant supervision of a competent tradesman.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
