

**SOUTHLAND ELECTRICAL WORKERS.—EXTENDING SCOPE OF
APPRENTICESHIP COMMITTEE.**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Southland District Electrical Workers' apprenticeship order, dated the 26th day of September, 1940, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XL, p. 1593.

Friday, the 21st day of February, 1941.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the electrical trade in that part of the Otago and Southland Industrial District lying within a radius of twenty miles from the Chief Post-office in Invercargill has made application to the Court for an order extending the locality in which the said Committee is authorized to exercise its powers so as to include the Southland, Wallace, Fiord, and Stewart Island Counties and the Kingston Riding of the Lake County: And whereas the Court is satisfied that it is the general wish of the employers and workers engaged in the said trade in the said district that such extension be made. Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by section 6 (3) of the Apprentices Amendment Act, 1930, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the locality in which the Invercargill Electrical Trades Apprenticeship Committee is authorized to exercise its powers shall be and it is hereby extended so as to include the Southland, Wallace, Fiord, and Stewart Island Counties and the Kingston Riding of the Lake County.

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
