

WELLINGTON (TWENTY-FIVE-MILE RADIUS) **COACH AND MOTOR-BODY BUILDERS.**—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Wellington (Twenty-five-mile Radius) Coach and Motor-body Builders' apprenticeship order, dated the 27th day of August, 1924, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol XXV, p. 792.

Monday, the 28th day of April, 1941.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the coach and motor-body building industry in that part of the Wellington Industrial District lying within a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office, Wellington, has made application to the Court for an amendment of the Wellington (Twenty-five-mile Radius) Coach and Motor-body Builders' apprenticeship order, dated the 27th day of August, 1924, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXV, p. 792: Now, therefore, this Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said order shall be amended by adding the following proviso to clause 6 thereof:—

“ Provided that for a period of two years from the 1st September, 1940, the proportion of apprentices in the panel-beating department shall be one apprentice to each panel-beater employed.”

2. That this order shall operate from the day of the date hereof.
