

AUCKLAND TRANSPORT BOARD TRAMWAY EMPLOYEES.—
EXEMPTION FROM GENERAL ORDER.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940; and in the matter of the Auckland Transport Board Tramway Employees' industrial agreement, dated the 8th day of December, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 1697.

Friday, the 26th day of June, 1942.

UPON reading the application of the Auckland Transport Board, party to the Auckland Transport Board Tramway Employees' industrial agreement, dated the 8th day of December, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 1697, and upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said Board and of the union of workers concerned, this Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on it by clause 9 of the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and of every other power in that behalf thereto enabling it, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That those workers referred to in item (c) of the Court's judgment dated the 26th day of June, 1942—namely, those workers who received an increase of 1d. per hour, and who do not work regularly on Sundays—shall be excluded from the operation of the general order of 31st March, 1942.

2. That this order shall be deemed to have operated and taken effect as from the 7th day of April, 1942.
