

NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT TANNERS.—
AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Northern Industrial District Tanners' award, dated the 2nd day of October, 1942, and recorded in 42 Book of Awards 1137.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Northern Industrial

District Tanners' award, dated the 2nd day of October, 1942, and recorded in 42 Book of Awards 1137, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended—

(i) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The following shall be the minimum rates of wages:—

“ Operators or assistants on any machine used in the industry and not otherwise provided for in this award shall be paid 1d. per hour in addition to the minimum rate for adult workers.”

(ii) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 4 (Employment of Youths), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) Youths may be employed at the following minimum rates of pay:—
