AUCKLAND CHEMICAL-MANURE WORKERS.—AMENDMENT OF AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Labour Disputes Investigation Act, 1913, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Auckland Chemicalmanure Workers' agreement, dated the 6th day of December, 1943, and recorded in 44 Book of Awards 193.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Auckland Chemicalmanure Workers' agreement, dated the 6th day of December, 1943, and recorded in 44 Book of Awards 193, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said agreement shall be amended—
- (i) By deleting subclause (b) of clause 6 (Overtime), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—
- "(b) When workers are required to work overtime after 6 p.m. or after 1 p.m. on Saturday, and have not been notified the previous night, the employer shall provide a substantial meal consisting of at least bread, butter, meat, cheese, and tea, coffee, or cocoa, or pay each worker 2s. in lieu thereof.

"The provisions of clause 17 of this agreement increasing rates of remuneration shall not apply to the meal-money

payment provided for in this subclause."
