

**CANTERBURY CARDBOARD-BOX, CARTON, AND PAPER-BAG  
MAKERS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Canterbury Cardboard-box, Carton, and Paper-bag Makers' award, dated the 29th day of November, 1944, and recorded in 44 Book of Awards 929.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Canterbury Cardboard-box, Carton, and Paper-bag Makers' award, dated the 29th day of November, 1944, and recorded in 44 Book of Awards 929, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended—

(i) By deleting subclauses (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), and (g) of clause 3 (Classification and Wages), and substituting therefor the following sub-clauses:—

(ii) By deleting subclause (b) of clause 10, and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

"Twenty-four hours' notice shall be given to any worker called upon to work overtime after the ordinary time for ceasing work, but where such notice is impracticable the worker shall be paid 2s. tea-money, providing such worker cannot get home for a meal in the time allowed.

"The provisions of clause 15 of this award increasing rates of remuneration shall not apply to the meal-money payment provided for in this subclause."

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
