

CANTERBURY **DENTAL ASSISTANTS AND TECHNICIANS.**—
AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Canterbury Dental Assistants and Technicians' award, dated the 22nd day of August, 1938, and recorded in 38 Book of Awards **2184.**

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Canterbury Dental Assistants and Technicians' award, dated the 22nd day of August, 1938, and recorded in 38 Book of Awards 2184, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended—

(i) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 3 (Wages) of Part I, and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The following shall be the minimum rates of wages for the respective classes of workers:—

“ ‘ A ’ grade technicians .. £6 16s. 8d. per week.

“ ‘ B ’ grade technicians .. £5 16s. 8d. per week.”

(ii) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 2 (Wages) of Part II, and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The following shall be the minimum rates of wages:—

“ For the fifth six months	2	8	0
“ For the sixth six months	2	14	0
“ And thereafter	3	3	0

“ Provided that a worker of the age of twenty-one years or upwards shall be paid not less than the basic wage for the time being prevailing.”

2. That, for the purpose of removing doubts as to the operation of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively, it is hereby declared that the amended rates of remuneration provided by this order shall be increased to the extent and in the manner set forth in the said two general orders of the Court.

3. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
