

SOUTHLAND PROVINCIAL DISTRICT **BUTCHERS.**—AMENDMENT
OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Southland Provincial District Butchers' award, dated the 16th day of December, 1935, and recorded in 35 Book of Awards 1464.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Southland Provincial District Butchers' award, dated the 16th day of December, 1935, and recorded in 35 Book of Awards 1464, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended—

(i) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 2 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) Workers shall be paid not less than the wages specified in the following scale:—

	Per Week.

“ First shopman or man in charge ..	6 8 6
“ First small-goods-man ..	6 8 6
“ All other workers connected with the shop or small-goods department ..	5 7 0
“ Person in charge of hawking cart ..	5 1 0”

(ii) By deleting the amount of “2s.” in clause 3 (Casual Labour), and substituting therefor the amount of “2s. 9d.”

(iii) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 4 (Boys and Youths), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) Employers may employ boys and youths at not less than the following rates:—

	Per Week.

“ Under sixteen years of age ..	1 2 6
“ From sixteen to seventeen years of age, having served one year at the trade ..	1 7 6
“ From seventeen to eighteen years of age, having served two years at the trade ..	1 15 0
“ From eighteen to nineteen years of age, having served three years at the trade ..	2 10 0
“ From nineteen to twenty years of age, having served four years at the trade ..	3 5 0
“ From twenty to twenty-one years of age, having served five years at the trade ..	3 15 0
“ Over twenty-one years of age, at ordinary journeymen's rates.”	

2. That, for the purpose of removing doubts as to the operation of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively, it is hereby declared that the amended rates of remuneration provided by this order shall be increased to the extent and in the manner set forth in the said two general orders of the Court.

3. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
