NEW ZEALAND METAL TRADES' EMPLOYEES.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Taranaki, Marlborough, Nelson, and Westland Industrial Districts.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the New Zealand Metal Trades' Employees' award, dated the 30th day of June, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 655.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the New Zealand Metal Trades' Employees' award, dated the 30th day of June, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 655, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said award shall be amended—
- (i) By deleting the words and figures "Boilermakers .. 2s. 9d. per hour" in clause 7 (Wages—II, Boilermaking and Structural Steel Section), and substituting therefor the words and figures "Boilermakers .. 3s. 0½d. per hour."
- (ii) By deleting the schedule of wage rates in clause 7 (Wages—III, Moulding Section), and substituting therefor the following schedule of wage rates:—

2. That, for the purpose of removing doubts as to the operation of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively, it is hereby declared that the amended rates of remuneration provided by this order shall be increased to the extent and in the manner set forth in the said two general orders of the Court.

3. That this order shall operate only in respect of the Taranaki, Marlborough, Nelson, and Westland Industrial Districts.

4. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
