

**MASTERTON MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES.—AMENDMENT OF
AWARD**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Masterton Municipal Employees' award, dated the 3rd day of April, 1940, and recorded in 40 Book of Awards 240.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Masterton Municipal Employees' award, dated the 3rd day of April, 1940, and recorded in 40 Book of Awards 240, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting subclauses (a) and (b) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(b) Junior Workers: Workers under the age of twenty-one, other than those specified above, employed as park assistants, £3 7s. 6d. per week, with annual increases of 10s. until adult rate is reached.”

2. That, for the purpose of removing doubts as to the operation of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively, it is hereby declared that the amended rates of remuneration provided by this order shall be increased to the extent and in the manner set forth in the said two general orders of the Court.

3. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
