

SOUTHLAND LOCAL BODIES' **CLERICAL WORKERS.**—
AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Southland

Local Bodies' Clerical Workers' award, dated the 25th day of November, 1938, and recorded in 38 Book of Awards 3436.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Southland Local Bodies' Clerical Workers' award, dated the 25th day of November, 1938, and recorded in 38 Book of Awards 3436, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting clause 4, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ The basic wage shall apply in the case of both female and male workers, including typists, on the worker reaching the age of twenty-one years.

“ Senior female typists, with a minimum of seven years of service, and female machine operators shall receive £6 10s. per annum in addition to the rates prescribed in the above schedule.”

2. That, for the purpose of removing doubts as to the operation of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively, it is hereby declared that the amended rates of remuneration provided by this order shall be increased to the extent and in the manner set forth in the said two general orders of the Court.

3. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
