

NEW ZEALAND **TIMBER-WORKERS**—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the New Zealand Timberworkers' award, dated the 1st day of September, 1942, and recorded in 42 Book of Awards 961.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the New Zealand Timberworkers' award, dated the 1st day of September, 1942, and recorded in 42 Book of Awards 961, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended—

(i) By deleting the amount of "1s. 6d." in subclause (d) (Shifts) of clause 2 (Hours of Work), and substituting therefor the amount of "2s. 6d."

(ii) By deleting subclauses (b), (c), and (f) of clause 5 (Wages and Classifications), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

"(c) *Night-watchman.*—(i) A night-watchman shall be paid a minimum wage of £5 1s. 8d. per week for the work of watching and generally cleaning up, and £5 6s. 8d. per week for one whose duties include work necessitating an engine-driver's ticket. The hours of work not to exceed forty-eight hours per week.

"(ii) Night-watchmen employed by any one employer for more than nine months in any one year shall be entitled to an annual holiday of two weeks on pay in lieu of the holidays provided for other workers under this award."

"(f) *Dirty Work.*—When workers are required to enter flues or incinerators for the purpose of cleaning them, or chip and/or clean the interior of boilers while such boilers are laid off for inspection or overhaul, and for the dismantling of

interior brickwork, they shall be paid 2s. 6d. extra for each day or part of a day they are so employed. Workers employed at charcoal burning or creosote preserving shall receive 2s. 6d. extra per day or part of a day."

(iii) By deleting subclause (b) of clause 7 (Boys and Youths), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

"(b) (i) Except at bush or town log-sawmill undertakings, boys or youths may be employed at not less than the following weekly rates of pay:—

"(ii) The wages for boys or youths employed in any branch or department of logging undertakings, bush-sawmill undertakings, or in town log sawmills shall not be less than:—

"In bush workings any boy or youth under seventeen years of age who may be employed shall be deemed to have commenced such employment at the age of between seventeen to eighteen years, and shall be paid for the first and subsequent years the wage rates set out above for such commencing age. This clause shall not operate so as to displace any adult bush worker."

(iv) By deleting subclauses (c) and (f) of clause 8 (Kiln Drying), and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

"(c) The minimum rate of wages for a kiln-boiler attendant shall be £5 17s. 6d. per week for a worker not requiring a certificate, and £6 2s. 6d. per week for one attending a boiler or boilers necessitating an engine-driver's ticket."

"(f) A kiln-operator shall be paid the sum of £5 12s. 6d. per week."

(v) By deleting subclause (c) of clause 18 (Female Workers), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(c) The minimum rates of weekly wages for female workers under this award shall be:—

(vi) By deleting the amount of “2s. 9d.” in clause 21 (Electric Mills), and substituting therefor the amount of “3s. 0½d.”

(vii) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 31 (Wages and Classification—Bush, Trammig, and Tramway Workers), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The following shall be the minimum rates of wages payable to adult workers for the several classes of workers hereinafter specified. The classification herein provided shall be deemed to include all workers generally employed in connection with the industry, but if by the exigencies of the business any question should arise relating to the classification of any worker not specified herein, such matter shall be determined by the Disputes Committee if the employer and branch union secretary are unable to agree:—
