

NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT **TAILORS**.—AMENDMENT OF
AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Northern Industrial District Tailors' award, dated the 16th day of March, 1944, and recorded in 44 Book of Awards 104.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Northern Industrial District Tailors' award, dated the 16th day of March, 1944, and recorded in 44 Book of Awards 104, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated 7th July, 1945) shall be amended—

(i) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The minimum wage for men employed on weekly wages, including pressers, shall be £6 1s. 8d. per week.”

(ii) By deleting the figures and symbols “2s. 0½d.” in subclause (d) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the figures and symbols “2s. 0¾d.”

(iii) By deleting the figures and symbols “3s. 1d.” in subclause (f) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the figures and symbols “3s. 1½d.”

(iv) By deleting subclauses (b) and (c) of clause 4 (Overtime), and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(b) Pieceworkers—From 6 p.m. to 9 p.m.: 1s. 7d. per hour extra, and thereafter at the rate of 3s. 1½d. per hour extra. From 6 a.m. to 8 a.m.: 1s. 7d. per hour extra.

“(c) All work done after 1 p.m. on the weekly half-holiday shall be paid for as follows: Weekly hand, double time; pieceworkers, 3s. 1½d. per hour extra.”

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
