

**WELLINGTON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT CHEMICAL-MANURE AND  
ACID WORKERS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Wellington Industrial District Chemical-manure and Acid Workers' award, dated the 29th day of September, 1944, and recorded in 44 Book of Awards 705.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Wellington Industrial District Chemical-manure and Acid Workers' award, dated the 29th day of September, 1944, and recorded in 44 Book of Awards 705, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended—

(i) By deleting subclause (b) of clause 3 (Overtime—Part I), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(b) When workers are required to work overtime after 5.45 p.m., or after 1 p.m. on Saturday, and have not been notified the previous night, the employer shall provide a substantial meal consisting of at least bread, butter, meat, cheese, and tea, coffee, or cocoa, or pay each worker 2s. in lieu thereof.

“The provisions of clause 18 of this award increasing rates of remuneration shall not apply to the meal-money payment provided for in this subclause.”

(ii) By deleting the schedule of rates of wages in clause 9 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following:—

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
