## NORTH CANTERBURY CHAFFCUTTERS AND BALERS.— AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the North Canterbury Chaffcutters and Balers' award, dated the 1st day of December, 1942, and recorded in 42 Book of Awards 1532.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the North Canterbury Chaffcutters and Balers' award, dated the 1st day of December, 1942, and recorded in 42 Book of Awards 1532, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended—

(i) By deleting subclauses (a) and (f) of clause 3 (Rates of Pay), and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

"(a) The minimum rates of pay per ton shall be as follows:—

"(f) While men are stripping wallops or old straw sacks they shall be paid not less than 2s. 94d. per hour."

(ii) By deleting subclauses (a) and (b) of clause 16 (Rates of Pay on Balers and Pressers), and substituting therefor the following subclauses — Hay Strew

"(b) For hand-baling the rate shall be not less than  $\pounds 1$  6s. 5d. per ton, which rate shall be paid to one man, or where two men are employed the rate shall be equally divided."

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1945.
