

AUCKLAND (TWENTY-ONE-MILE RADIUS) BUTCHERS.—
AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Auckland (Twenty-one-mile Radius) Butchers' award, dated the 7th day of December, 1942, and recorded in 42 Book of Awards 1405.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Auckland (Twenty-one-mile Radius) Butchers' award, dated the 7th day of December, 1942, and recorded in 42 Book of Awards 1405, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting clause 5 (as amended by order of the Court dated the 26th day of June, 1945), and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ Wages

“ 5. Workers shall be paid not less than the wages specified in the following scale:—

“(e) All wages prescribed in this clause are weekly wages and are not subject to any deduction save for time lost through sickness, accident, or default of the worker.”

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 21st day of September, 1945.
