AUCKLAND (TWENTY-ONE-MILE RADIUS) BUTCHERS.— AMENDMENT OF AWARD

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting clause 5 (as amended by order of the Court dated the 26th day of June, 1945), and substituting therefor the following clause:—
