

NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT **ELECTRICAL WORKERS.**—  
AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923; and in the matter of the Northern Industrial District Electrical Workers' apprenticeship order, dated the 26th day of September, 1938, and recorded in 38 Book of Awards 2904.

Monday, the 5th day of November, 1945.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the North Island Electrical Trades' Industrial Union of Workers has made application for amendment of the Northern Industrial District Electrical Workers' apprenticeship order, dated the 26th day of September, 1938, and recorded in 38 Book of Awards 2904: And whereas the Court has heard the representatives of the employers and workers bound by the said order: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That clause 24 of the said apprenticeship order shall be deleted and the following clause substituted therefor:—

“24. It shall be an implied term in every contract of apprenticeship that the employer will during the prescribed term, to the best of his power, skill, and knowledge, train and instruct the apprentice, or cause him to be trained and instructed, as a competent journeyman in the branch of the trade to which the apprenticeship applies, in accordance with the provisions of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and of this order and any amendments.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
