

NEW ZEALAND PRIVATE-HOTEL CLERICAL WORKERS.—
AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the New Zealand Private-hotel Clerical Workers' award, dated the 13th day of March, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 173.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the New Zealand Private-hotel Clerical Workers' award, dated the 13th day of March, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 173, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting sub-clause (a) of clause 2 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The minimum weekly rates of wages shall be as follows:—

	1st.	2nd.	3rd.	4th.
Females—				
Where four or more clerical workers are employed	66/-	58/6	51/-	46/-
Where three clerical workers are employed ..	61/-	51/-	46/-	..
Where two clerical workers are employed ..	56/-	48/6
Where one clerical worker is employed ..	51/-
Males	97/10”

2. That, for the purpose of removing doubts as to the operation of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively, it is hereby declared that the amended rates of remuneration provided by this order shall be increased to the extent and in the manner set forth in the said two general orders of the Court.

3. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
