

NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT **SADDLEMAKERS, BAGMAKERS, ETC.**—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923; and in the matter of the Northern Industrial District Saddlemakers, Bagmakers', &c., apprenticeship order, dated the 22nd day of September, 1924, and recorded in 25 Book of Awards 978.

Monday, the 5th day of November, 1945.

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas the Apprenticeship Committee set up in connection with the saddlemaking, bagmaking, &c., trade in the Northern Industrial District has made application to the Court for amendment of the Northern Industrial District Saddlemakers, Bagmakers', &c., apprenticeship order, dated the 22nd day of September, 1924, and recorded in 25 Book of Awards 978: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That clause 2 of the said apprenticeship order shall be deleted, and the following clause substituted therefor:—

“2. The branches of the trade or industry to which this order shall apply are saddlemaking, bagmaking, machining, harnessmaking, collarmaking, bridle cutting, and canvas working.”

2. That clause 6 of the said apprenticeship order (as amended by order of the Court dated the 9th day of May, 1927) shall be further amended by deleting subclause (a), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) Subject to subclause (c), the proportion of the total number of apprentices to the total number of journeymen employed by any employer in any one branch shall be not more than one to one journeyman or fraction thereof.”

3. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
