NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT BRICKLAYERS AND PLASTERERS.—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the order made on the 29th day of October, 1945, amending the Northern Industrial District Bricklayers and Plasterers' apprenticeship order, dated the 19th day of December, 1924, and recorded in 25 Book of Awards 1489.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and for the purpose of correcting an error in the order made on the 29th day of October, 1945, amending the Northern Industrial District Bricklayers and Plasterers' apprenticeship order, dated the 19th day of December, 1924, and recorded in 25 Book of Awards 1489, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

That clause 4 of the order made on the 29th day of October, 1945, shall be deleted, and the following clause substituted therefor:—

"4. That this order, in so far as it applies to the plastering trade, shall be deemed to have taken effect on the 1st day of April, 1945, and, in so far as it applies to the bricklaying trade, shall be deemed to have taken effect on the 1st day of July, 1945."

MEMORANDUM

When an application to amend the Northern Industrial District Bricklayers and Plasterers' apprenticeship order was heard in Auckland the Court was informed that the employers and workers in the plastering section of the industry covered by the order had agreed that the amendment should operate from the 1st April, 1945, but that there was no such agreement in the case of the bricklaying section. In making the amending order the Court overlooked the intimation given to it of the partial agreement, and has now made the above correction to give effect to the wishes of the parties.
