## NORTH CANTERBURY HOSPITAL BOARD CLERICAL EMPLOYEES .- AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.-In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the North Canterbury Hospital Board Clerical Employees' award, dated the 8th day of August, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 970.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the North Canterbury Hospital Board Clerical Employees' award, dated the 8th day of August, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 970, this Court doth hereby order as follows :----

1. That the said award shall be amended-

(i) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclause :---

"(a) The minimum weekly rates of wages shall be as follows :---

(ii) By deleting clause 9, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

## "Meal Allowance

"9. Any worker called upon to work overtime after 6 p.m. on any day of the week shall be paid 2s. meal allowance.

" FEMALES

"The provisions of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively, shall not apply to the meal-money payment provided for in this clause."

2. That, for the purpose of removing doubts as to the operation of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively, it is hereby declared that the amended rates of remuneration provided by this order shall, except where otherwise provided, be increased to the extent and in the manner set forth in the said two general orders of the Court.

3. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
