NEW ZEALAND MOTION-PICTURE OPERATORS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the New Zealand Motion-picture Operators' award, dated the 31st day of March, 1939, and recorded in 39 Book of Awards 314s

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the New Zealand Motion-picture Operators' award, dated the 31st day of March, 1939, and recorded in 39 Book of Awards 314, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That clause 3 (Wages and Hours) of the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 22nd day of May, 1945) shall be amended by deleting subclauses (a), (b), and (c), and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—
- "(a) Motion-picture operators employed in continuouspicture shows and/or shows giving two performances a day, for a week not exceeding forty hours, shall be paid not less than £6 6s. 8d. per week.
- "(b) Motion-picture operators employed in picture-theatres showing eight screenings per week, for a week not exceeding thirty-six hours, shall be paid not less than £5 18s. per week.
- "(c) Motion-picture operators employed in picture-theatres showing seven screenings per week, for a week not exceeding thirty-four hours, shall be paid not less than £5 9s. 11d. per week."
- 2. That, for the purpose of removing doubts as to the operation of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively, it is hereby declared that the amended rates of remuneration provided by this order shall be increased to the extent and in the manner set forth in the said two general orders of the Court.
- 3. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
