

DUNEDIN CITY CORPORATION LIBRARIANS AND THEIR ASSISTANTS.—AMENDMENT OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Dunedin City Corporation Librarians and Their Assistants' industrial agreement, dated the 15th day of August, 1944, and recorded in 44 Book of Awards 1042.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Dunedin City Corporation Librarians and Their Assistants' industrial agreement, dated the 15th day of August, 1944, and recorded in 44 Book of Awards 1042, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said industrial agreement shall be amended by deleting clause 2, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“Salaries

“2. The following shall be the minimum rates of salaries:—

“Provided that, in the case of the assistant cataloguer, if such officer be fully qualified to discharge the duty of Reading-room Librarian and is required by the employer to undertake duties in both capacities, such officer shall be graded for salary purposes as a Reading-room Librarian.

“Male Clerical Library Assistants: Scale in accordance with commencing scale in Dunedin City Council Clerical and other Employees’ award.

“Temporary General Assistants: £2 7s. 6d. per week.

“Notwithstanding any other provision in this agreement, any adjustments in salaries of existing staff that may be needed to bring salary rates into conformity with the above salary classification shall be made in such manner and at such times as the employer may determine after consultation with the union.”

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
