

CANTERBURY, NELSON, MARLBOROUGH, AND WESTLAND
**SHOP TAILORING TRADE EMPLOYEES.—AMENDMENT OF
 AWARD**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Canterbury, Nelson, Marlborough, and Westland Shop Tailoring Trade Employees' award, dated the 6th day of October, 1943, and recorded in 43 Book of Awards 488.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Canterbury, Nelson, Marlborough, and Westland Shop Tailoring Trade Employees' award, dated the 6th day of October, 1943, and recorded in 43 Book of Awards 488, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That subclause (a) of clause 2 (Part II—Wages) of the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 11th June, 1945) shall be deleted, and the following subclause substituted therefor:—

“(a) The minimum wage for men employed on weekly wages, including pressers, shall be £6 1s. 8d. per week.”

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.
