

CANTERBURY **HAIRDRESSERS.**—AMENDMENT OF
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1923, and its amendments; and in the matter of the Canterbury Hairdressers' apprenticeship order, dated the 21st day of August, 1925, and recorded in 25A Book of Awards 741.

Wednesday, the 17th day of April, 1946

WHEREAS by section 5 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1923, the Court is empowered to amend any order made under section 5 (1) of the said Act: And whereas application has been made for amendment of the Canterbury Hairdressers' apprenticeship order, dated the 21st day of August, 1925, and recorded in 25A Book of Awards 741: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the apprenticeship committee set up in connection with the industry in the locality concerned, and has heard the duly appointed representatives of the employers and of the workers in the industry: Now, therefore, the Court in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said apprenticeship order, in so far as it relates to that part of the Canterbury Industrial District lying north of the Rangitata River, shall be amended in the manner following:—

(i) By deleting clause 5 (as amended by order of the Court dated the 21st December, 1932), and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“5. The term of apprenticeship shall be five years.”

(ii) By deleting clause 8 (as amended by order of the Court dated the 26th March, 1946), and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“8. The minimum weekly rates of wages payable to apprentices shall be the undermentioned percentages of the nominal weekly rate of wages for journeymen hairdressers, as prescribed by the award or agreement relating to the employment of such journeymen in force from time to time in the locality:—

“ For the first six months	23
“ For the second six months	29
“ For the third six months	35
“ For the fourth six months	41
“ For the fifth six months	47
“ For the sixth six months	53
“ For the seventh six months	59
“ For the eighth six months	65
“ For the ninth six months	71
“ For the tenth six months	77 ”

2. That this order shall take effect on the day of the date hereof.
