## NEW ZEALAND INSULATORS, LTD., EMPLOYEES.—AMENDMENT OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of New Zealand Insulators, Ltd., Employees' industrial agreement, dated the 17th day of February, 1943, and recorded in 43 Book of Awards 272.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said industrial agreement (as amended by order of the Court dated the 22nd day of August, 1945) shall be further amended

in the manner following:-

(1) By deleting subclauses (a) and (c) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—
