## NEW ZEALAND (EXCEPT MARLBOROUGH AND WESTLAND)

 CANVAS-WORKERS.-AMENDMENT OF AWARDIn the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.-In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942 ; and in the matter of the New Zealand (except Marlborough and Westland) Canvas-workers' award, dated the 6th day of May, 1947, and recorded in 47 Book of Awards 815.
In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncementmade by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:-

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following :-
(1) By deleting subclauses (a), (b), and (c) of clause 4 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subelauses:-
"(a) Journeymen shall be paid not less than 3s. 7d. per hour.
"(b) Youths.-Youths may be employed at not less than the following rates of pay:-

" Provided that workers commencing over sixteen years of age shall be paid 5 s. per week in addition to the above rates; and over severiteen years of age 7s. 6d. per week in addition to the above rates; and over eighteen years of age 10s. per week in addition to the above rates; but this proviso shall not operate so as to increase journeymen's rates:
" Provided, also, that workers over twenty-one years of age shall be paid not less than $£ 55$ s. per week.
" (c) Females.-Females may be employed at not less than the following rates of pay:-

"Provided that workers commencing over sixteen years of age shall be paid 5 s. per week in addition to the above rates; and over seventeen years of age 7s. 6d. per week in addition to the above rates; and over eighteen years of age 10s. per week in addition to the above rates; but this proviso shall not operate so as to increase the rate of $£ 40 \mathrm{~s} .9 \mathrm{~d}$.:
"Provided, also, that workers over twenty-one years of age shall be paid not less than $£ 33 \mathrm{~s}$. per week."
(2) By deleting clause 5 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration).
(2) That this order shall come into force on the 1st day. of October, 1947.
