WELLINGTON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT UMBRELLA-MAKERS.— AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Wellington Industrial District Umbrella-makers' award. dated the 7th day of July, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 733.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said award (as amended by Order of the Court dated the 25th day of July, 1945) shall be further amended in the manner

following :--

(1) By deleting subclauses (a), (b), (c), and (d) of clause 4 (Wages),

and substituting therefor the following subclauses:

"(a) The minimum rate of wages for journeymen shall be £6 12s. 3d.

per week.

"(b) The minimum rates of wages for junior males shall be as Per Week follows:-

"(c) The minimum rate of wages for journeywomen shall be

(2) By deleting clause 5 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration), and

substituting therefor the following clause:-

"Exclusion from Operation of General Orders

"5A. The rates of remuneration provided for in this award shall not be subject to the provisions of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively."

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October,

1947.
