ELECTRIC PRODUCTS, LTD., AUCKLAND, FEMALE FACTORY EMPLOYEES.—AMENDMENT OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Electric Products, Ltd., Auckland, Female Factory Employees' industrial agreement, made on the 22nd day of June, 1944, and recorded in 44 Book of Awards 466.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said industrial agreement (as amended by order of the Court dated the 25th day of July, 1945) shall be further amended in the manner following:—
- (1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 3 (Rates of Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—
- "(a) Female workers shall be paid not less than the following minimum weekly rates of wages:—
